


We invite you to walk down the brick road, to explore the *ordinary*, and with a bit of imagination, uncover and take away something *extraordinary* with you.
















1 Al-I

Al-Khair Mosque

Founded in the early 1960s on a hilltop surrounded by vegetable farms along Choa Chu Kang Road. Today, Al-Khair Mosque offers religious, education and social services to the Muslim community in Choa Chu Kang, Bukit Panjang and Yew Tee.

Keat Hong Garden

Keat Hong Mirage and Keat Hong Quad are situated where Keat Hong Camps I & II once stood before being redeveloped in 2012. The military-themed playground within Keat Hong Garden pays homage to its military past and reminds residents the importance of defending our nation.

Arcade Shophouses

Nestled within HDB blocks is a stretch of shophouses along Choa Chu Kang Ave 1 that have stood the test of time. Some of these businesses have been around since the 1970s, serving generations of residents over the years, and are here to stay as your "extended neighbours".

Uttamayanmuni Buddhist Temple

Built in 1963 by reclaiming swamps and a lowlying pond, the temple stands out with its Theravada Buddhist architecture. It is also the only temple in Singapore that features traditional Thai wall murals that depict the life story of Buddha and his teachings.
