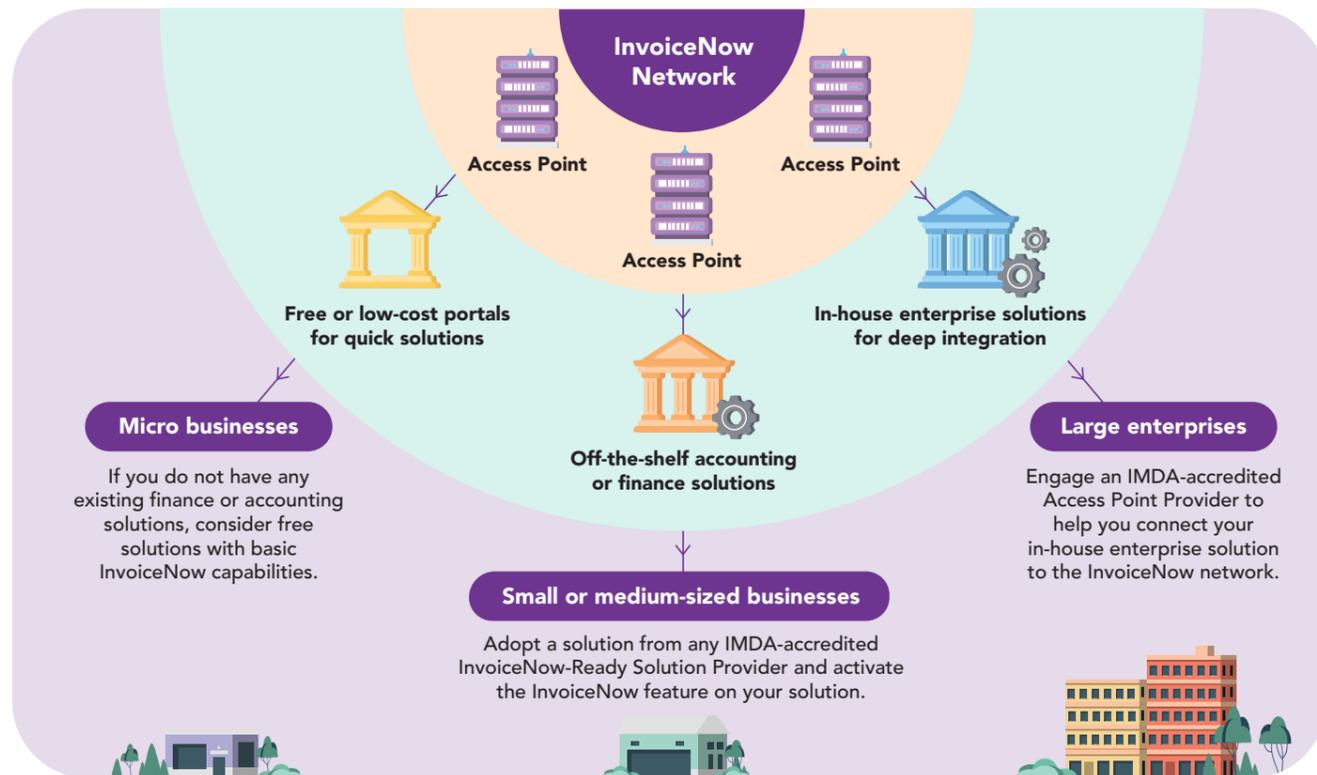

What is InvoiceNow?

Introduced in 2019 by the Infocomm Media Development Authority (IMDA), InvoiceNow is the nationwide e-invoicing network that enables businesses of all sizes to boost productivity in invoice processing.

Operating on the international Peppol standard, InvoiceNow enables seamless transmission of e-invoices securely across different finance systems.

Over 63,000 businesses in Singapore are already on the InvoiceNow network, utilising a variety of InvoiceNow services offered by InvoiceNow-Ready Solution Providers (IRSPs) and Access Point (AP) Providers.



Join us on the road towards efficient tax compliance

To support the nationwide InvoiceNow initiative and digitalise tax administration, GST-registered businesses will be required to use InvoiceNow-Ready Solutions to submit invoice data to the Inland Revenue Authority of Singapore (IRAS).

Businesses will continue to fulfil their existing GST responsibilities, including the filing of GST returns and the keeping of proper business and accounting records.

What is the GST InvoiceNow Requirement?

GST-registered businesses must send invoice data pertaining to their GST supplies and purchases to IRAS using InvoiceNow-Ready Solutions via the InvoiceNow network. Invoice data covers all data on invoices or equivalent documents that serve as bills of payment (or adjustments of bill for payment) for supplies and purchases made.

Tax invoices

Credit notes

Aggregated cash sales, aggregated petty cash purchases



Roadmap for the GST InvoiceNow Requirement

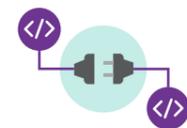
GST-registered businesses will be required to onboard InvoiceNow and submit invoice data directly to IRAS via the InvoiceNow network. This will be mandated in phases.

IMPLEMENTATION DATE	BUSINESSES INVOLVED
1 November 2025	Companies that register for GST voluntarily within 6 months of incorporation date
1 April 2026	All new voluntary GST registrants, regardless of their incorporation date or business structure
1 April 2028	All new compulsory GST registrants Existing GST-registered businesses with total annual supplies* ≤ S\$200,000
1 April 2029	Existing GST-registered businesses with total annual supplies* ≤ S\$1,000,000
1 April 2030	Existing GST-registered businesses with total annual supplies* ≤ S\$4,000,000
1 April 2031	Existing GST-registered businesses with total annual supplies* > S\$4,000,000

*Total annual supplies refer to the total value of standard-rated, zero-rated and exempt supplies made in all the prescribed accounting periods ending in calendar year 2025.

Gearing up and preparing early

Here's how you can ensure a smooth transition for the GST InvoiceNow Requirement.



Step 1:
Ensure that your solution is InvoiceNow-Ready

Step 2:
Register for InvoiceNow and obtain your Peppol ID

Approach your InvoiceNow-Ready Solution Provider and/or Access Point Provider to register your business in the SG Peppol Directory with your UEN and obtain your Peppol ID.

Step 3:
Enable the GST InvoiceNow submission feature

Enable the GST InvoiceNow submission feature in your InvoiceNow-Ready Solution so that your business can submit invoice data directly from the solution to IRAS. Those using an in-house enterprise solution should contact their Access Point Provider to ensure that your solution is connected to IRAS and that the GST InvoiceNow submission feature is enabled.
