Background on Horizon Europe

About Horizon Europe

Horizon Europe is the European Union (EU)'s key funding programme for research and innovation, with a budget of €93.5 billion for the period 2021 to 2027.

Horizon Europe Pillar II – “Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness” funds collaborative projects implemented by international consortia. Activities are organised into six thematic clusters. Each cluster has its own grant calls that define the challenges, scope, and expected outcomes for projects in the cluster.

Can Singapore Entities participate in Horizon Europe Pillar II?

Yes, Singapore entities can participate as partners in consortia formed by entities from EU Member States/Associated Countries, to jointly submit proposals to grant calls in Horizon Europe Pillar II.

(Note: As partners, Singapore entities will not be able to initiate/coordinate projects, and will need to be self-funded/funded by other sources).

Singapore-Horizon Europe (SG-HE) Complementary Fund

Singapore-Horizon Europe (SG-HE) Complementary Fund

What is the Singapore-Horizon Europe (SG-HE) Complementary Fund?

It is a unilateral funding arrangement by Singapore, administered by the National Research Foundation (NRF) of Singapore. The fund supports research or activities conducted in Singapore, by eligible Singapore entities that participate in Horizon Europe Pillar II projects in priority areas for Singapore.

How will this Fund affect participation by Singapore entities?

There is now an option for Singapore entities to apply to the SG-HE Complementary Fund, if they wish to receive funding support for participation in Horizon Europe Pillar II projects, if assessed to be eligible and the research is aligned with Singapore's RIE priorities.

- Singapore entities can receive in-principle approval of funding support from NRF, if their SG-HE Complementary fund application is considered supportable.
- Singapore entities can receive funding support from NRF, once their Horizon Europe Pillar II proposal has undergone evaluation and the project is awarded to their consortium.



Scope of Funding

Scope of Funding

What can the SG-HE Complementary Fund support?

Applicants may apply for SG-HE Complementary Fund Support to participate in Horizon Europe Pillar II Actions (Grant Calls) launching in 2026-2027, under the following Thematic Clusters and Missions.

Thematic Clusters	Thematic Cluster 1: Health Thematic Cluster 3: Civil Security for Society* Thematic Cluster 4: Digital Industry and Space Thematic Cluster 5: Climate, Energy and Mobility Thematic Cluster 6: Food, Bioeconomy, Natural Resources, Agriculture and Environment *For Thematic Cluster 3: Where the scope of the grant call meets Singapore's national strategic priorities. Applicants should check with NRF before submitting proposals.
Missions	Adaptation to Climate Change, Cancer, Healthy Oceans, Seas, Coastal and Inland Waters, Climate-neutral and Smart Cities, Soil Health and Food
Actions (Grant Calls)	Research and Innovation Actions (RIA) Innovation Actions (IA) Coordination and Support Actions (CSA)

Note:

Thematic Cluster 2: Culture, Creativity and Inclusive Society falls outside the SG-HE Complementary Fund's scope of funding

Scope of Funding

How will NRF assess eligibility of applications for funding?

NRF will assess the eligibility of the applicants, and whether the research/activity aligns with national strategic priorities in RIE, and contribute to building capabilities in Singapore's RIE ecosystem.

What budgetary items can be supported by the fund?

The SG-HE Complementary Fund may be used to cover expenses for items proposed by applicants, which include Expenditure of Manpower (EOM), Equipment (EQP), Other Operating Expenses (OOE), Overseas Travel (OT), Research Scholarships (RS) and other expenses approved by NRF.

How is funding support provided to successful applicants?

The SG-HE Complementary Fund will provide funding support on a quarterly reimbursement basis to the host institution of successful applicants. The host institution will be responsible for the collation of expenses and further disbursement of funds, as well as the management of the awarded project.



Eligible Applicants

Eligible Applicants

Which Singapore entities can apply for the SG-HE Complementary Fund?

Singapore-based Researchers from Publicly-Funded Research Institutions, and Companies carrying out research and innovation activities aligned with Singapore's RIE key areas can apply, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility criteria. They will be eligible for funding support at the following rates:

Singapore Entities	Direct Cost Funding Support	Indirect Cost Funding Support
Researchers from Publicly-Funded Research Institutions	100%	25% of Direct Costs (This mirrors Horizon Europe)
Companies	SMEs – 50% Larger than SME – 30%	Indirect Costs are not supported

Note:

SMEs are companies with group annual sales turnover not exceeding S\$100 million, or a group employment base of no more than 200 employees.

Companies must partner with a Publicly-Funded Research Institution in Singapore, which will serve as the host institution.

Eligibility Criteria

For Researchers from Publicly-Funded Research Institutions

Publicly-Funded Research Institutions:

Refer to Autonomous Universities (AUs), A*STAR research institutes, CREATE entities, polytechnics, public healthcare institutions, and the research institutes affiliated to the aforementioned institutions and entities. Such institutions are eligible to participate as host institutions.

Researchers from these institutions must fulfil the following requirements at the point of application and throughout the project:

- i. Hold a primary and/or joint appointment(s) at eligible host institution(s)**, with a minimum time commitment of 9 months (per calendar year) in Singapore; or be an international researcher with an existing residency commitment in Singapore under a CREATE project, that is supported by NRF; and
- ii. Be an accomplished Principal Investigator (PI) with a track record of leadership ability** in coordinating research program(s) and providing mentorship to research teams(s), as well as having productive research outcomes.
- iii. Researchers are expected to have a reasonable time commitment** to the project, commensurate with the proposed task(s) to be undertaken as a partner in the Horizon Europe project.

Eligibility Criteria

For Companies

Registered and Operating in Singapore: Be legally registered with the Accounting and Corporate Regulatory Authority (ACRA) and operate in Singapore, as verified through ACRA Bizfile and supporting documents (e.g. IRAS tax filing acknowledgements).

Governance: Have a compliant board structure, key personnel appointments and ongoing statutory filings, as verified through ACRA records and supporting documents.

- i. At least one director must be “ordinarily resident” in Singapore (citizen, PR, or certain work pass holders with the required consent). Each director must be at least 18, of full legal capacity, and not disqualified (e.g. undischarged bankrupt).
- ii. Companies must appoint a company secretary within six months from the date of incorporation. The secretary must be resident in Singapore. The sole director of a company and the company secretary cannot be the same person.
- iii. For companies nominating a PI, company directors/key officers (CEO/CTO) must endorse the PI.

Local Shareholding: Have at least 30% local equity held directly or indirectly by Singaporean(s) and/or Singapore PR(s), determined by ultimate individual ownership, as verified through supporting documents.

Financial Viability: Be financially capable to start and complete the proposed project, as verified through audited financial statements or certified management accounts for the last financial year.



How to Apply

How to Apply

- 1. Singapore entities will need to join a consortium** (including at least 3 independent entities from 3 different countries, at least 1 of which must be from an EU member state), in order to jointly submit a proposal to a Horizon Europe Pillar II grant call.
- 2. Singapore entities have the option to apply to the SG-HE Complementary Fund.** They will need to fill in an application form, and submit a draft/copy of the proposal to be submitted to the Horizon Europe Pillar II grant call. The proposal should include necessary details on the specific tasks to be implemented by Singapore entities.
- 3. NRF will check i) eligibility of the applicants, ii) alignment of the proposal with national strategic priorities in RIE, and contribution to building capabilities in the RIE ecosystem.** Applications which pass these checks will receive a document conveying in-principle approval of funding support.
- 4. NRF will provide SG-HE Complementary Fund support to Singapore applicants, conditional upon the evaluation and successful award of the Horizon Europe Pillar II proposal.** Singapore applicants will need to provide a copy of the i) Final Version of the Horizon Europe Proposal, ii) Evaluation Summary Report, and iii) Signed Consortium Agreement to NRF.

Call for Applications

Call for Applications on Research Grant Portal (RGP)

Applications for funding support from the Singapore-Horizon Europe (SG-HE) Complementary Fund for open or upcoming Horizon Europe Pillar II grant calls within the permitted scope of funding should be submitted through the Research Grants Portal (RGP) at <https://www.apply.gov.sg/grants/research>

Rolling Call for Applications

The call will open in April 2026, and will remain open on a rolling basis through 31 Dec 2027.

Apply before/after Proposal Submission to Horizon Europe

Singapore entities may apply for SG-HE Complementary Fund support, before or after the consortium submits a proposal to a Horizon Europe Pillar II grant call.

They will be supported by the SG-HE Complementary Fund as long as they meet the requirements for in-principle approval, and their proposal is awarded by Horizon Europe.

Topic description

Expected Outcome:

The REPowerEU plan and the EU Solar Energy Strategy introduced targets for the deployment of solar PV amounting to 600 GWac by 2030. Complying with these targets will be crucial for the European Union to reach its climate targets and free itself from import dependency on fossil fuels and the costs this imposes on Europe's competitiveness in terms of high energy prices. The Solar Strategy also introduces a target, which has been enshrined into the Net-Zero Industry Act, to re-consolidate the European solar manufacturing sector and scale up European manufacturing capacity across the entire value chain to at least 40% of the EU's annual deployment needs, or 30 GW of annual capacity by 2030. Innovation is particularly important in the solar PV sector, which is characterised by a short technology cycle, where new technolog

Expected Outcome:

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Project results are expected to contribute to all the following expected outcomes:

1. Increase the potential for commercialisation of tandem PV technologies creating a competitive technological know-how for the European PV industrial base;
2. Contribute to the objectives of the EU Solar PV Industry Alliance;
3. Support the execution of the solar energy joint research and innovation agenda.

Scope:

Proposals are expected to:

- Demonstrate tandem technologies with similar lifetimes to Si and higher efficiencies (beyond the Si limits);
- Demonstrate interface and thin-film large scale engineering;
- Demonstrate production processes and equipment ready for large scale deployment.

Whenever the expected exploitation of project results entails developing, creating, manufacturing and marketing a product or process, or in creating and providing a service, the plan for the exploitation and dissemination of results must include a strategy for such exploitation. Proposals will present a plan for the exploitation and dissemination of results which should include a strong business case and sound exploitation strategy. The exploitation plan should include preliminary plans for scalability, commercialisation, and deployment (feasibility study, business plan) indicating the possible funding sources to be potentially used (in particular the Innovation Fund).

This topic implements the co-programmed European Partnership for Innovation in Photovoltaics (EUPI-PV). As such, projects resulting from this topic will be expected to report on the results to the European Partnership for Innovation in Photovoltaics (EUPI-PV) in support of the monitoring of its KPIs.

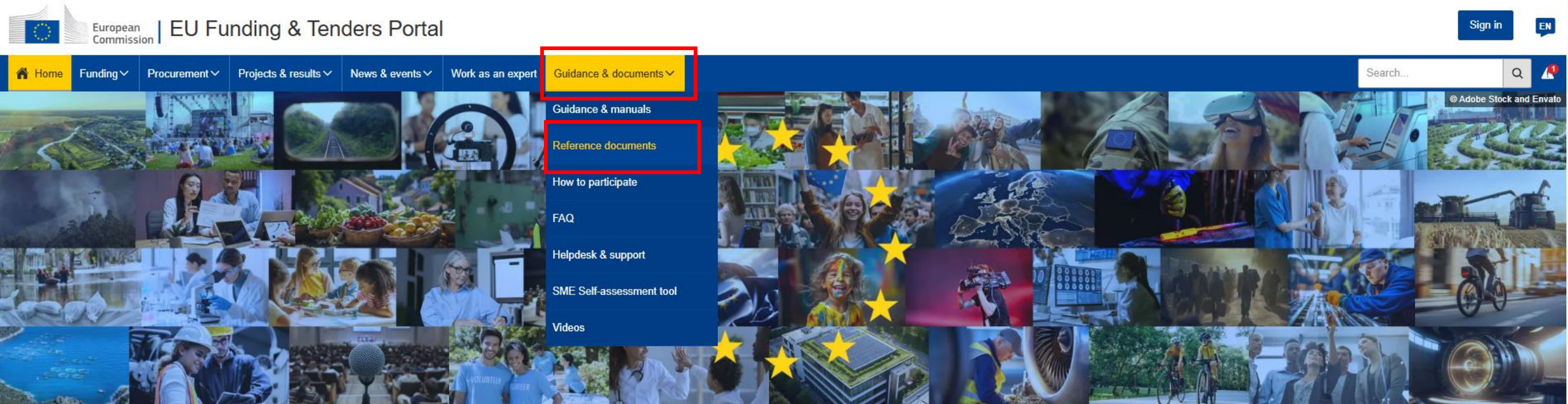

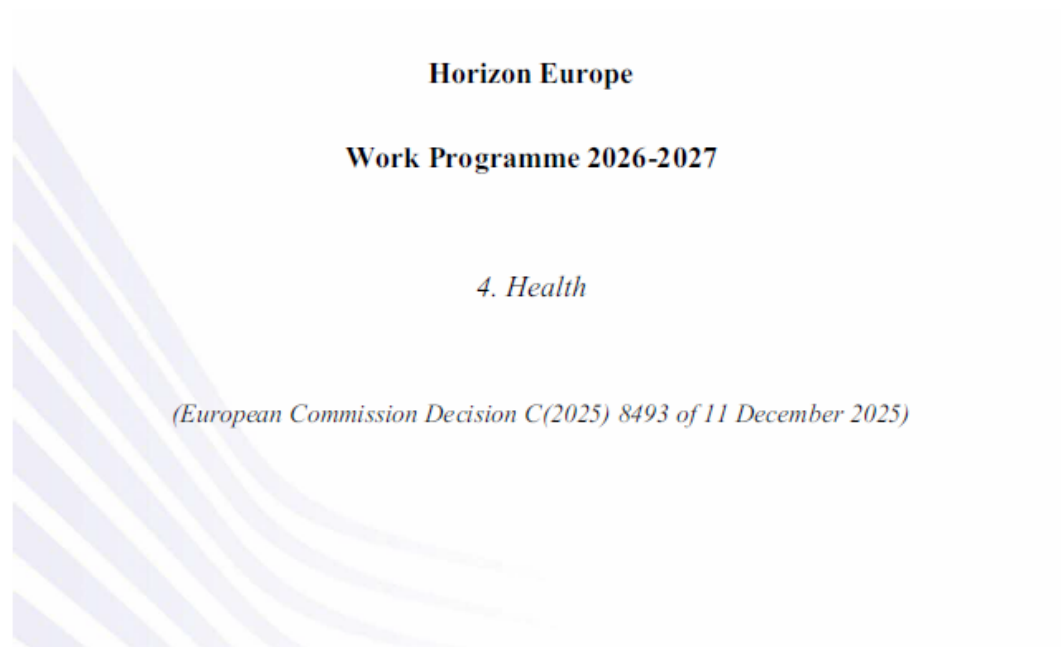

Registering on EU Funding and Tenders Portal

Do Singapore entities need to register on the EU Funding and Tenders portal?

Singapore entities participating in Horizon Europe (Pillar II) proposals should ensure their organisation has registered for a Participant Identification Code (PIC) here ([LINK](#)).

- This would allow the Project Coordinator of the consortium to formally list Singapore entities as partners in the proposal (with tasks, person-months, etc), when it is submitted to the Horizon Europe (Pillar II) grant call.

Singapore entities generally do not need to register for a Legal Entity Appointed Representative (LEAR) for their organisation.

- In most cases, Singapore entities would not directly receive Horizon Europe funds as a beneficiary, and would not be signatories to the Grant Agreement signed by the consortium upon receiving the Horizon Europe project award.
